

UGANDA UPDATE

Winter Preparation

Winter brings out different responses in people doesn't it? Some avoid it at all costs and head south for some months; others try and get some respite by heading to warmer climes for a week or two; while others tough it out and still others, enjoy it and the abundance of opportunity for new adventures exists.

Uganda sitting within a few kilometres of the equator does not face our challenges, but they have their own.

Yes, I have been keeping note on what has been going on in Uganda through your partnership and many of you will have received an email outlining the progress currently so I will not seek to cover those details in this letter. However, if you did not receive the email, I am attaching it with this Update.

Personally, it has been exciting to see the progress on so many fronts over the past three years – growth in number of Messianic congregations; growth in membership; Ladies Conference, Youth Conferences; initiation of projects to help the many needs in this country in small ways – new land purchased for a primary school and church headquarters; encouragement in establishing schools in other jurisdictions outside of Iganga; an experimental tomato project since Uganda has two complete growing seasons; initial efforts to establish chicken production on a small scale associated with congregations.

Project Opportunities

Each of the many ongoing projects have only been possible through your partnership and giving. For that I thank you on behalf of the believers in Uganda.


Recently as I saw the value of the CDN dollar plummet I realized that this year's Pastor's Conference, even if costs remain the same as previously, has increased by about 25-30% due to the exchange rate on the US dollar.

Here is a list of some of the project needs of which I am aware that continue to need funding:

1. The new school/church building in Iganga;
2. Small scale poultry ventures - broiler/egg;
3. More gardening initiatives;
4. Pastor's Conference expenses May 24 – 28 – facilities rental, travel, food, course materials, etc.
5. My trip expenses – insurance, food, lodging, travel in country and internationally, course materials, rental equipment, etc.
6. Purchase of books, magazine, DVD materials for the Pastor's Library.
